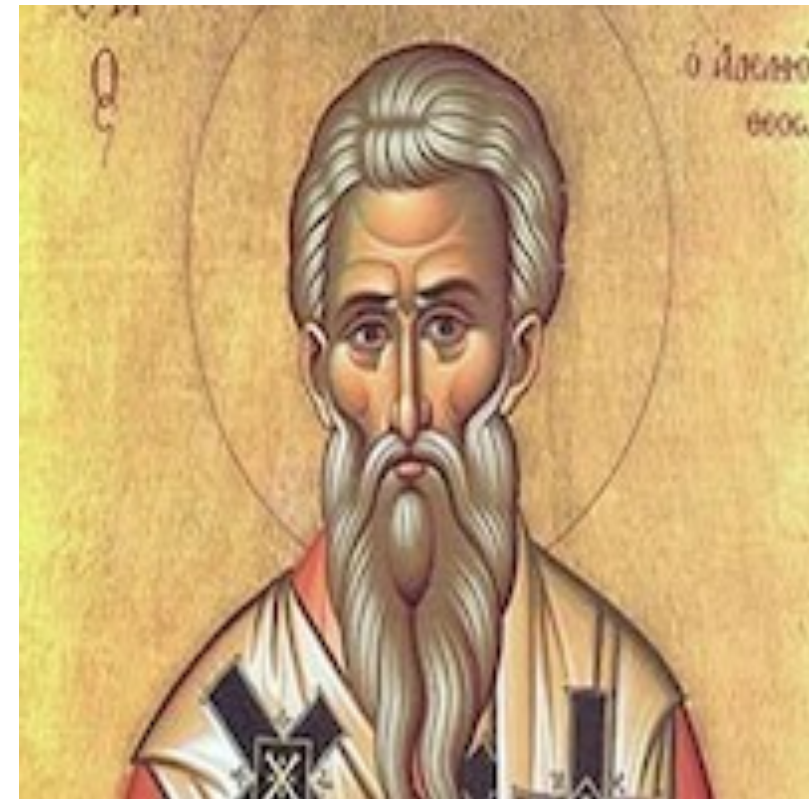
Phil 3:8-14

St. Hegesippus of Jerusalem
April 7

Born Jewish, he became an adult convert to Christianity. Hegesippus lived twenty years in Rome, Italy where he researched the early Church, but in later years he retired to Jerusalem. He was the first to trace and record the succession of the bishops of Rome from Saint Peter to his own day, and is considered the father of ecclesiastical history. Little of his writings survive, but he was highly recommended by other early writers including Eusebius and Saint Jerome. Compiled a catalogue of heresies during the first century of Christianity.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John.

Jn 8:1-11

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them. Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

Vegetarian Stuffed Mushrooms

24 large mushrooms
cooking spray
1/4 c green onions, sliced
1 clove garlic, minced
1/4 c butter
1/2 c bread crumbs
1/2 c shredded mozzarella cheese

1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Clean mushrooms, remove stems, and set stems aside. Place mushroom caps, stem sides down, in a baking pan. Lightly coat mushrooms with cooking spray. Bake for 4 minutes. Drain mushroom caps, stem sides down, on a plate with paper towels.
2. Chop the reserved stems to make about 1 cup. Cook stems, green onions, and garlic in a saucepan in hot butter until tender. Stir in bread crumbs and cheese. Turn mushrooms stem sides up and fill with breadcrumb mixture. Return mushroom caps to paking pan and bake for 8-10 minutes until heated through.
