Deacon's Dialogue

It has been a tough week for us and for my friends. We learned last week that my friend of 60 years and his wife had experienced a tragic death. Then on top of that, my brother and his wife also had the same kind of death occur.

My friend, David and his wife Penny, own a campground in Pennsylvania. They had driven down for a visit with family and friends, when they were notified that their youngest son had died, and that it was a drug related death. Within days, my brother let us know that his stepson, also in his mid-thirties, had died under the same circumstances. These were terrible shocks for Liz and myself, but I could not imagine anything of greater pain than having to put your own child to rest.

On Easter Monday, we drove to the East side to attend the memorial service which was held at Heritage Nondenominational Christian church. The service was not what I was used to, but I was honored by being asked to do two Scriptural readings.

On Wednesday, Liz and I drove to a Mausoleum in Kettering, Ohio. Again the service for my brother's stepson was non-denominational Christian. It was similar to the Monday service.

What I walked away with afterward, was that I couldn't adequately fathom the depth of the sorrow felt by the parents of both of these young men. I do not have the words to express my feelings of sorrow for the pain the parents, and especially their mothers, feel at the loss of their beloved child.

We just passed Good Friday, and the mother of Jesus had also gone through the same kind of experience, the death of her Son I saw the tears on those mothers eyes, and Christ's mother suffered the same pain.

And no, I am not forgetting the fathers. Their grief is there, just not as outward, kept inside more. Just the hugs we embraced, told the depth of pain inside.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John

John 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John Cramer

Italian Sausage Hoagies


2 Tbsp Olive Oil
5 Mild Italian Sausage Links
1 Green Bell Pepper, sliced
1 Red Bell Pepper, sliced
1 Sweet Yellow Onion, sliced
2 cloves garlic, minced
14.5 oz can Diced Italian Tomatoes with juice
1/2 tsp. salt
2-3 Tbsp. Italian Seasoning
1 tsp onion powder
1 Tbsp Brown Sugar
Hoagie Buns
Provalone Slices

In a large skillet on high heat, add the oil. Brown the sausages well on all sides to get a dark color on them. Place the sausages on a plate. Add the peppers and onions to the same skillet and cook for 5 minutes. Reduce the heat to medium and add the garlic for the last minute. Add the sausages back to the pan and dump in the diced tomatoes, salt, Italian seasoning, onion powder and brown sugar. Bring to a boil and reduce to simmer for 30-60 minutes, or until sausages are cooked through. Toast the hoagie buns, add cheese to the inside and place in the sausage and pepper mixture. Add parmesan cheese if desired.
