Deacon's Dialogue

Twice a week, Monday and Friday, Deacon Thomas in Wisconsin, Deacon Gail in Florida, and I meet on Skype. We catch up on what is going on in our respective parishes, and chat a bit upon what is going on in the world, the country and in our church. We have interesting discussions in which we resolve the troubles of and in the world, the country. We then get to the main purpose of our Skype visit, which is prayer.

As Deacons, we use the prayers which are handed down for centuries. These are prayers, part of the Divine Office, and used worldwide by the Catholic Church, and some other denominations. These are very beautiful prayers, and they vary daily. They are utilized during various times of the day, for example, Morning prayer, mid-morning prayer, midday prayer, evening prayer, and so on. Now as Deacons, we are obligated to pray twice daily, morning prayer and evening prayer. These prayers are taken from passages in the Bible, and they have been used for hundreds of years, especially by the clergy who lived monastic lives, and were regulated by their Abbots.

There is one prayer which is always used, and it is the Lord's Prayer, and it comes just before the petitions during which we add any special prayer requests that we may have. If there is someone you would like added to our prayer list, let me know.

I shall be looking at the Lord's prayer and bringing its meaning clear to me. Most of it self-explanatory, but this will be for my benefit, beginning with the first words – OUR FATHER. What do these words signify to me?

Lk 12:32-48

Jesus said to his disciples: “Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms. Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be. “Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.” Then Peter said, “Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?” And the Lord replied, “Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his mas-

ter on arrival finds doing so. Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property. But if that servant says to himself, 'My master is delayed in coming,' and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant's master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful. That servant who knew his master's will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master's will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly. Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John:

Kansas City Burgers

Ingredients:

1 lb. Ground Beef or Ground Turkey (your choice)
3/4 c. Kansas City Style Bar-B-Que sauce
4 Strips Bacon (regular or Turkey)
4 slices American or Cheddar Cheese
4 Leaves Romaine Lettuce
2 small or 1 medium tomatoe, sliced
1/2 c. Mayonnaise
4 Hamburger buns


Form the meat into 1/4 lb. patties. Place on the grill on medium flame. Spread the 1/2 of the Bar-B-Que sauce onto the top of the meat. Close the grill. Place the bacon in a frying pan on medium-high heat. After 3 minutes, flip the burgers, spreading the remaining sauce on the meat. Cook 3 more minutes. Cook bacon to desired crispiness and place on a paper towel to dry. Cook burgers for 3 more minutes on each side. Spread Mayonnaise onto the buns. On the top bun place a leaf of lettuce and a tomatoe slice. 1-2 minutes before the meat is done cooking, place cheese on top of meat and let it melt. Assemble the sandwich.
