A Reading from the Holy Gospel According to St. Matthew

Matthew 14:22-33

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

Sausage, Spinach and White Bean Soup

1 lb pre-cooked sausage, sliced
1 onion, diced
1 clove garlic, minced
1 tbsp olive oil
4 cups chicken broth
2 (14.5oz) cans white beans, undrained
1 (9oz) package spinach, thawed and drained
1 bay leaf
salt and pepper to taste
1/3 cup grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese

Directions:

1. In a large pot, saute onions, garlic, and sausage in olive oil over medium heat until sausage has browned and onions are transparent. Add chicken broth, beans and spinach. Season with bay leaf, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil and reduce heat to low. Simmer for 30 minutes. Top each bowl of soup with Parmigiano-Reggiano before serving.
