Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

Black Beans and Rice

1 tbsp olive oil

1 onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced

3/4 C uncooked rice

1 1/2 C chicken broth (or water)

2 tsp cumin

2 tsp turmeric

dash of cayenne pepper

1 (14.5 oz) can black beans, drained and rinsed

1 (14.5 oz) can corn, drained

1 (10.5 oz) can diced tomatoes with green chillies

1/4 c cilantro, chopped (optional)

Directions:

1. In a medium sized pot, sauté onions and garlic in olive oil. Add rice, chicken broth, and spices; bring to a boil. Cover, lower the heat, and cook for 20-25 minutes, until all the broth has been absorbed. Stir in beans, corn, tomatoes, and serve. Top with cilantro if desired.
