


Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John:

Chicken Cordon Bleu Casserole

Ingredients (N.B. Substitutions of different brands will degrade the taste of the final product):
2 Boxes Stove Top Chicken Stuffing
1 can Campbell's Cream of Mushroom soup
1/2 can Campbell's Golden Mushroom soup
1 8 oz. package diced ham
2 1/2 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breasts or thighs
1 8 oz. package sliced Swiss Cheese
1 8 oz. package sliced Muenster Cheese
1 6 oz. package French's French Fried Onions

Preheat oven to 425. Cut chicken into cubes (the smaller the better.) Cook in a large rimmed pan with enough water to keep the chicken from sticking. Cover and cook until done (about 15 min.) on Medium-High. While the chicken is cooking, prepare the stuffing according to the directions on box. Grease a 9"x13" pan. Create a layer of stuffing on the bottom of the pan (using your hands, wet, to smooth it out.) Cover with an entire layer of Swiss cheese. Strain the cooked chicken, place in a large bowl, and mix together with Cream of Mushroom and Golden Mushroom soups, ham, and 1/2 of the onions. Mix well and place on the Swiss Cheese layer using a spatula. Smooth and cover with a layer of Muenster Cheese. Sprinkle Salt and Pepper over the top. Place in oven for 20 minutes. Remove and place remaining onions on top, bake for 5 minutes. Let set for 5 minutes, cut and enjoy. Enjoy this week's puzzle!
