Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Marcia Shantz:

Pull-Apart Hawaiian BBQ Sliders

12 Hawaiian dinner rolls (or any rolls), halved lengthwise
3 cups chopped cooked turkey (or chicken)
³/₄ cup shredded Cheddar cheese (or cheese of your choice),
¹/₃ cup barbeque sauce
¹/₂ red onion, thinly sliced
¹/₂ cup finely chopped parsley (optional)
2 tablespoons melted butter
¹/₄ cup grated Parmesan cheese
1 tsp garlic powder

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Place the roll bottoms in 9 X 13 glass baking dish sprayed with cooking spray. Mix turkey with barbeque sauce. Divide turkey mix, cheese, onion, and parsley equally over the rolls. Cover with roll tops; melt butter and mix in garlic powder. Brush with melted garlic butter. Sprinkle Parmesan cheese on top. Bake in the preheated oven until golden brown and cheese is melted, about 20 minutes. Slice and serve.
