St. Leocadia of Toledo
December 9

Slave. Beaten and imprisoned for refusing to denounce her faith during the Diocletian persecutions. Scheduled for torture and either apostasy or martyrdom, she learned of the abuse being suffered by the 13 year old Saint Eulalia of Merida. Leocadia prayed for God to remove her from a world where such evil occurred; she died soon after, of no particular cause, without being touched by her torturers. Ancient and popular cultus developed in Toledo, Spain. Died c. 303 at Toledo, Spain

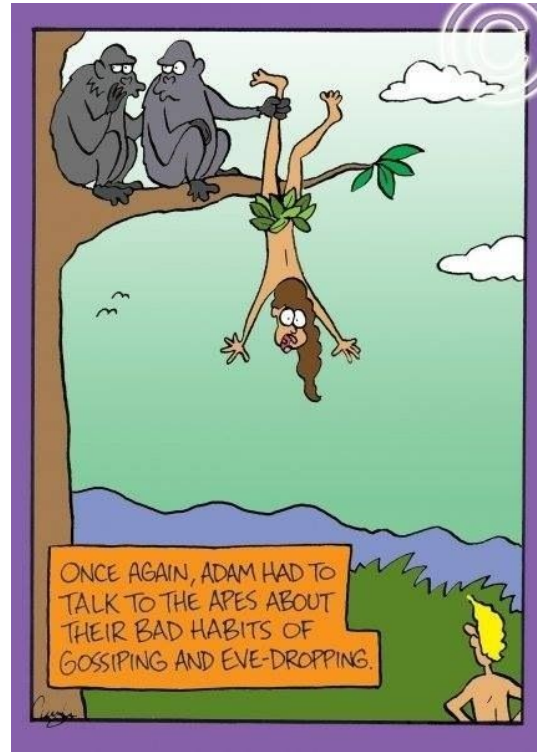

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Mrs. Suzanne Snizek.

Peach French Toast Bake

1 large baguette (about 8 oz)
4 whole eggs
4 egg whites
1 cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
5 cups sliced peaches, fresh or frozen
1 ½ tablespoons lemon juice
3 tablespoons brown sugar
¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon

Spray a 9 by 13 inch baking pan with cooking spray. Slice the baguette into ½ inch slices and arrange the slices in a single layer in the baking pan. Whisk together the eggs, egg whites, milk and vanilla. Pour the egg mixture over the bread in the pan. In a medium bowl, toss peaches with lemon juice and 1 tablespoon of the brown sugar. Scatter the peach slices evenly on top of the bread. Combine the remaining brown sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle over the top. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Uncover and bake for 40 minutes.
