PASTOR'S NOTE FALL 2018



Happy Autumn!

In these months as summer gives way to winter, it is a great time to contemplate the later cycle of life. Inevitably,

all life will end.

I am reminded of a poem by Linda Ellis entitled *The Dash*. In this poem, the author starts by looking at a tombstone, which gives the year of birth and year of death, with a dash in between. The author then goes on to speak of the importance of the dash, and looks at what is important and what is not. A poignant line in the poem reads, "For it matters not, how much we own, the cars... the house...the cash. What matters is how we lived and loved and how we spend our dash. "

So, how do we spend our dash? Do we turn our eyes and attention to seek comfort and ease in our lives? Do we turn our eyes and attention outward, to the children, the elderly, the disabled, the suffering, the lonely, the lost, the forgotten? Fall Pierogi Sale




