

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John.

Alaskan BBQ Salmon

1 c. Brown Sugar (dark)
1/2 c. Honey
1 dash Liquid Smoke flavoring
1/2 c. Apple Cider Vinegar
1 4 lb. whole Salmon fillet

Directions:

Preheat grill for high heat. In a small bowl mix together brown sugar, honey, liquid smoke and vinegar. Brush one side of the salmon with the basting sauce. Place the salmon on the grill, basted side down. After about 7 minutes, generously baste the top, and turn over. Cook for about 8 more minutes, then brush on more basting sauce, turn and cook for 2 minutes. Take care not to overcook the salmon as it will lose its juices and flavor if cooked too long. Serve with Brussels Sprouts or Asparagus.
