This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish:

Slow Cooker Chicken Chili

2 chicken breasts
1 (24 oz) jar of salsa
1 clover garlic, minced
3 tsp cumin
2 tsp chili powder
salt and pepper to taste
1 (11 oz) can of Mexican style corn, drained
1 (15 oz) can pinto beans, drained and rinsed
1 (15 oz) can diced tomatoes


Directions:

Mix all ingredients together in a slow cooker. Cook on low for 6-8 hours
2. About 1 to 2 hours before you want to eat, shred the chicken in the pot with 2 forks and continue cooking.
3. Serve with cheese, sour cream, green onions, cilantro, etc...
