**Deacon's Dialogue**  
***Rev. Mr. Richard Kasprzak***

I am writing this on Monday, as I am going in to Henty Ford for the second surgery on my heart. They tell me it's no big deal, but any time people poke around the heart IT'S A BIG DEAL.

Last week's cartoon made me think about Biblical times again. In six hundred years, it will be Liz and mine six hundred and fiftieth anniversary, and I sure am glad I don't have to worry about that one. I have a hard enough time figuring out what she would like for our next one, maybe a gift card to Target???

What kind of education did the people back then have? In Biblical times, the word for education, in Hebrew, translates to "to train." By the time of Christ, teachers were known as Rabbi or Master.

Jesus was described in the Bible as Teacher about fifty times. He taught in the synagogue, the Temple, and He taught His Disciples, which also was a name for pupils of a teacher. Higher education was usually connected to the Temple, with a hierarchy within it. It was usually the well to do, and the well connected, who had the opportunity and the expense of sending their boys to Temple schools to become Scribes, which was a very prestigious position. The majority of Jewish men had enough education to be considered literate in the time of Christ, and most knew Aramaic, Hebrew, Greek, and a little Latin. In Galilee, students began studies at the Synagogue at about five, both girls and boys, studying Scripture. By the age of ten, many had memorized portions of scripture, and could quote from it. Boys continued their studies, while girls eventually learned from their moms needed tasks.

The common people learned mostly from their parents, with the roles of men and women being taught by the mother for girls. The boys learned from their fathers, and eventually entered into a trade, either with the father, or another relative.

It's Wednesday evening, and I am back home. Sore, and bruised, but doing better. Hope that this is my last heart surgery. My buddy Deacon, Gail, also was in surgery on Monday. He had stomach done, and is in great pain. Please say a prayer for him.

**Our Savior Recipe Section**

This week's recipe is by Fr. John (inspired by the *Food Network*).

**Salisbury Steak with Mushrooms**

Directions:

1 lb, Ground Beef	3-5 Tbsp. Salted Butter
1 lg. egg, lightly beaten	8 oz. Sliced Mushrooms
1/3 c. Onion, finely chopped	2 tsp. Worcestershire Sauce
7 Saltine Crackers, crushed	3 Tbsp. Flour
1 tsp. Minced, fresh Sage	1-2 Tbsp. chopped Parsley
Kosher Salt and Ground Pepper	Buttered Egg Noodles for Serving.

Gently mix the beef, egg, onion, cracker crumbs, sage, 1/2 teaspoon salt and a few grinds of pepper in a large bowl using your hands. Divide into 4 equal portions and shape into oval patties, about 1/2 inch thick.

Heat 1 tablespoon butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Brown the patties, about 4 minutes per side. Transfer to a plate.

Add 1-2 tablespoon butter to the skillet and cook the mushrooms until slightly browned, about 2 minutes. Stir in the Worcestershire sauce, and salt and pepper to taste, scraping up any browned bits. Sprinkle in the flour and stir, then stir in 2 1/2 cups hot water and simmer until the sauce begins to thicken, about 2 minutes. Add the remaining 1-2 tablespoon butter, swirling to combine.

Return the patties and any juices from the plate to the skillet. Simmer until the sauce thickens and the patties are cooked through, about 2 minutes. Sprinkle with parsley and season with salt and pepper. Serve with noodles, if desired.
