Matthew 4:12-23

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what had been said through Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled: Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the way to the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles, the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen. Roasted Asparagus


1 lb asparagus, trimmed
3 tbsp olive oil
1 1/2 tbsps Parmesan cheese
1 clove garlic, minced
salt and pepper to taste
1 tbsp lemon juice

1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees.
2. Place asparagus in a bowl, combine with olive oil, Parmesan, garlic, salt, and pepper; toss to coat. Arrange asparagus in a single layer on a baking sheet.
3. Bake until tender, about 10-15 minutes. Sprinkle with lemon juice before serving.
