What a weekend. I had trouble sleeping Saturday early morning, my asthma was bothering me. It got worse, and I went to the ER. They tried oxygen, but the plastic hose in the nostrils bothered me too much, so I took it out and used an inhaler. I got better, and later on the doctor asked if I had taken all my pills that morning. I had not, and told her so. She said with my AFIB, I can't be missing my meds, so she ordered up a set of pills. I took them, and started getting ready to head home. The doctor said I looked pale, so she checked my heart rate, and found it about fifty. I had to wait a little to see how it went, but at the next check, it had dropped to about forty. So instead of going home, it was back to bed till she could get a handle on the cause. She then ordered a new med for me, to stabilize my heart rate. A new doctor on Sunday morning figured out the cause, wrong med earlier. I got back to 65 beats, and went home Sunday noon.

Both doctors emphasized that I should get the next heart ablation as soon as possible, instead of waiting till April as I was going to do. They said (both lady doctors) that with my history I should not delay any more than I possibly could, so, in preparation, I shall be seeing Fr. John and getting anointed on Thursday.

I also told Fr. John how much I missed the little cartoons that we used to see in the bulletin. Humor is one of the most important things that keep us going, no matter the context. You know, Christ had a great sense of humor. Just think of the people he picked to spread the news – fishermen instead of scholars. I always remember the cartoon of Christ playing basketball, and Peter rejecting him at the goal net three times.

Savory Heart-Healthy Pasta

1 box Whole Wheat Angel Hair Pasta
6-8 c. Water
1 grilled chicken breast, cut into cubes
1/2-1 c. Olive Oil
1 Tbsp. Italian Seasoning
1 Tbsp. Crushed Red Pepper
1/2 Tbsp. Oregano
1 Tbsp Paprika

Directions:

Boil water in a large pot. Place pasta into boiling water. Place olive oil into a sauce pan. Heat. Stir in seasonings. Stir in grilled chicken breast. When pasta is al dente, strain and place into a bowl. Pour the olive oil and chicken mixture into the pasta. Toss and serve.
