Deacon's Dialogue

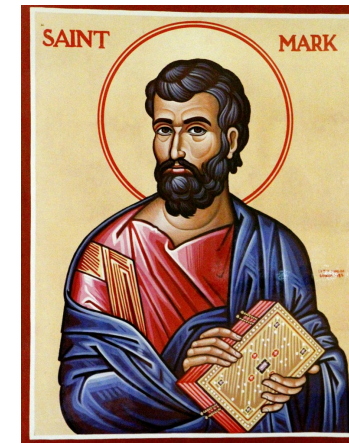
It is one very important privilege that I have, as a Deacon, to proclaim the Lord's Gospel at Mass. Last Sunday, I again took the privilege, asked Fr. John's blessing, and proceeded to the Ambo. I intoned the Blessing, and proceeded with the proclamation. Here I erred. I credited St. Mathew for the Gospel, when it was written by St. Mark. Fortunately, I did proclaim the correct word of Christ, I just am glad that I knew which Gospel it was. So easy to make an error.

So who was St. Mark? Christianity identifies St. Mark the Evangelist as one of the "Seventy Disciples" sent out by Jesus to disseminate the Gospel. About A.D. 42, St Peter met with St. Mark, and they travelled together spreading the words of Christ. He is revered in the Coptic (Eastern Churches) as the founder of the Church in Alexandria, an important early Church. There are, of course, many different traditions about St. Mark. What I have written here, I took from a study of many pages. He is represented as a Lion, and there are many relics of His throughout Christianity. Coptic tradition says He was martyred in 68 A.D.

What I have written here is a compendium from what is known about St. Mark. It is really interesting to trace where some of our beliefs and traditions come from.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark.

Mk 5:21-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, “My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live.” He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him.

There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years. She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors and had spent all that she had. Yet she was not helped but only grew worse. She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak. She said, “If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured.” Immediately her flow of blood dried up. She felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction. Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him, turned around in the crowd and asked, “Who has touched my clothes?” But his disciples said to Jesus, “You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet you ask, ‘Who touched me?’” And he looked around to see who had done it. The woman, realizing what had happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He said to her, “Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction.”

While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official’s house arrived and said, “Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?” Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, “Do not be afraid; just have faith.” He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, “Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep.” And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child’s father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week’s recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish:

Garlic Chicken w/Rosemary and Lemon

2 lb chicken breasts, chunked
6 cloves garlic, minced
1 tbsp dried rosemary
3 tsp olive oil
1 tbsp grill seasoning or salt and pepper
1 tbsp lemon juice
1/2 c white wine or chicken broth

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 450 degrees.
2. Arrange chicken in a baking dish and add garlic, rosemary, olive oil, and grill seasoning. Toss to coat and place in oven; roast 20 minutes.
3. Remove from oven and add wine/broth and lemon juice to dish and stir in to combine with pan juices. Return to oven and turn oven off. Let stand 5 minutes, then remove chicken from oven. To serve, spoon pan juices over chicken.
