I am writing this Dialogue on Wednesday, almost eleven o'clock, looking forward to not being a bachelor again. If this is Sunday, we have an organist once again.

I just spoke to Liz, and they are approaching Washington D.C. on their way back from Cape Hatteras North Carolina. Now as most people who have worked with me know, I am not the neatest person in the world. Matter of fact, the word "Neatnick" has no relation to what I can do to a kitchen when cooking. And I have been cooking for 12 days (maybe I can come up with a song about twelve days in the kitchen with Rick). Now my grandson, David, stopped by yesterday (remember I am writing this on Wednesday at eleven P.M.) and I asked him if he wanted to cook. He did, and did he. I cleaned up after, and now I know how Liz feels. Funny, girls often do not mind cleaning up if someone else cooks.

I noticed something in the Gospels, the fact that women play such a big role in the life of Jesus, and how He uses them to point out lessons. Women were important, and they must have provided a lot of support for Christ during His ministry on earth. There are over 16 references to women who interacted with Jesus, many of them named. Women at that time were not as valued as men were, but Jesus always held them in high esteem, and treated them with Love, affection, and courtesy. A person named Mary appears at least sixty times in the Gospels, in about fifty verses.

### **Our Savior Recipe Section**

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish:

#### Reuben Pizza

1 batch pizza dough, store bought or homemade  
1/2 c thousand island dressing  
2 c shredded Swiss cheese  
6 ounces deli corned beef, cut into strips  
1 c sauerkraut, rinsed and drained

Directions:

1. Preheat the oven to 425 degrees. Grease a large pizza pan and spread the dough out on the pan.
2. Spread half of the salad dressing over the pizza dough. Sprinkle with half of the Swiss cheese. Arrange corned beef over the cheese, then drizzle with the remaining salad dressing. Top with sauerkraut and remaining Swiss cheese.
3. Bake for about 20 minutes in the preheated oven, until cheese melts and crust begins to become golden brown.
