## **Our Savior Recipe Section**

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish:

### Reuben Pizza

1 batch pizza dough, store bought or homemade  
1/2 c thousand island dressing  
2 c shredded Swiss cheese  
6 ounces deli corned beef, cut into strips  
1 c sauerkraut, rinsed and drained



Directions:

1. Preheat the oven to 425 degrees.
2. Grease a large pizza pan and spread the dough out on the pan.
3. Spread half of the salad dressing over the pizza dough. Sprinkle with half of the Swiss cheese. Arrange corned beef over the cheese, then drizzle with the remaining salad dressing. Top with sauerkraut and remaining Swiss cheese.
4. Bake for about 20 minutes in the preheated oven, until cheese melts and crust begins to become golden brown.
