I would like to talk for a moment about Blessed Fr. Solanus Casey. Most of us know him as the healing doorman from the monestary on Mt. Elliot St. in Detroit, but he was someone who, despite many setbacks, both personal and physical, never complained. In fact, he thanked God for everything that came his way, good or bad. In the end, he suffered with painful boils on his skin, but he thanked God for that, since it allowed him to know what Christ suffered in a personal way and helped him to become compassionate.

I think that we all can learn much from Blessed Solanus. We tend to complain about everything... small or large. In our diocese right now, there are 3 good men... good priests and a deacon, who are trying to cover all of the faithful. If we become engulfed in our own wishes and ignore what God wants for his people by complaining or trying to impose our will over His will, then what we are doing is making ourselves gods instead of letting God be God. So, the next time we want to complain about our suffering, let us think about Blessed Solanus, and instead thank God for the gift that He gave us to enter more closely into His life, instead of trying to impose our will over His. His way is always the right way because He created us and always knows what is best for us, even though we might not see it that way in the moment.

We all suffer in some way. However, it is up to us to decide if we are going to be more like Blessed Solanus, or think only of ourselves. In suffering we ultimately find comfort and become closer to God. The next time we feel like complaining about our lives, what is going right or wrong, or whatever is not leading up to our expectations, remember what Blessed Solanus went through, and never complain.

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

Garlic Roasted Chicken with Rosemary and Lemon

2 lb chicken breasts, chunked
6 cloves garlic, minced
1 tbsp dried rosemary
3 tsp olive oil
1 tbsp grill seasoning or salt and pepper
1 tbsp lemon juice
1/2 c white wine or chicken broth

Directions:


1. Preheat oven to 450 degrees.
2. Arrange chicken in a baking dish and add garlic, rosemary, olive oil, and grill seasoning. Toss to coat and place in oven; roast 20 minutes.
3. Remove from oven and add wine/broth and lemon juice to dish and stir in to combine with pan juices. Return to oven and turn oven off. Let stand 5 minutes, then remove chicken from oven. To serve, spoon pan juices over chicken.
