Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

Sausage, Spinach and White Bean Soup

1 lb pre-cooked sausage, sliced
1 onion, diced
1 clove garlic, minced
1 tbsp olive oil
4 cups chicken broth
2 (14.5oz) cans white beans, undrained
1 (9oz) package spinach, thawed and drained
1 bay leaf
salt and pepper to taste
1/3 cup grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese


Directions:

1. In a large pot, saute onions, garlic, and sausage in olive oil over medium heat until sausage has browned and onions are transparent. Add chicken broth, beans and spinach. Season with bay leaf, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil and reduce heat to low. Simmer for 30 minutes. Top each bowl of soup with Parmigiano-Reggiano before serving.
