Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John:

Marinated Asian Chicken Salad

12 oz. Oven Roasted Diced Chicken Breast
12 oz. bag Romaine Lettuce Mix
4-6 oz. Teriyaki Marinade
2 cups Grated Cheddar Jack Cheese
8 oz. can Sliced Water Chestnuts
3 oz. Real Bacon Bits
3 oz. Sesame Seeds
4-6 oz. Asian Sesame Vinaigrette Dressing
4 oz. Lo Mein Noodles

Open the diced chicken breast and pour in the Teriyaki marinade. Reseal and place in refrigerator for 2-4 hours. Coat a frying pan with olive oil and heat. When oil is hot, place marinated chicken in pan and cook for 4-6 minutes, until hot. In a bowl, mix the lettuce, cheese, water chestnuts, bacon bits, sesame seeds and dressing. Toss until uniformly mixed. Place on individual plates. Add chicken to top of salad on plates. Sprinkle lo mein noodles as desired. Serves 2-4.
