Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John Cramer.

Asian Chicken Salad


1 oz. Olive Oil
1 9 oz. bag of pre-cooked chicken strips
1 10 oz. bag of Romaine Lettuce Mix
2 oz. Shredded Cheddar Cheese
1.5 oz. Sunflower Seeds
1.5 oz. Bacon Crumbles
4-5 oz. Cardini's Asian Sesame Dressing
Chow Mein Noodles

Coat a skillet with the olive oil and bring to a medium-hot temperature. Place chicken in skillet and cook for 3-4 minutes on each side to lightly brown. While the chicken is cooking, in a large bowl mix the lettuce, cheese, sunflower seeds, bacon crumbles, and dressing. Toss until well mixed. On a plate, place 1/2 of the lettuce mixture and about 1/2 of the chicken on top of the mixture. Cover with chow mein noodles to taste.
Serves 2.
