Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

Black Bean and Rice Salad

1 cup uncooked rice

3 tbsp olive oil

2 tbsp lime juice

2 tsp red wine vinegar

1 tsp cumin

1/4 cup cilantro, chopped

1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved

1 (14.5 oz) can corn, drained

1 (14.5 oz) can black beans, drained and rinsed

Salt and pepper to taste

- 1. Cook rice according to package directions.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk together olive oil, lime juice, red wine vinegar, and cumin. Add cilantro, tomatoes, corn, and black beans and toss to coat.
- 3. When the rice is fully cooked, add to vegetables and mix well. Salt and pepper to taste and add extra cumin if desired. Serve immediately or refrigerate before serving.
