Broasted Cornish Hens with Sautéed Portobello Mushrooms

2 Portobello Mushroom Caps
1/8 lb. Butter

Melt butter in skillet. Sautee to desired consistency, about 5 minutes.


2 Cornish Hens
1/8 lb. Butter
1 tsp. Garlic Powder
1/2 tsp. Salt

Rub garlic powder and salt on hens. Place in a broasting pan with butter. Braise at 375 for 1 hour in oven, basting every 15 minutes. Remove hens from oven, cut in half length-wise, baste with the butter and return to oven. Broil on high for 10-20 minutes. Serve with mushrooms.
