Deacon's Dialogue

I hope that my recent two columns have given all those who read them, an idea as to who I am, and the road I took to get here. My attitudes to life, to living it, to how I conduct my affairs, and to whom I am trying to become, has been made clear.

Looking around our church, and I mean the PNCC, I suspect that most of us have turned out in the same way. Our attitudes to church have changed, maybe, and the ones among us who go to church, the attitudes are pretty similar. Church is for me a place of refreshment, a place I walk into, look up at the cross with Jesus still upon it, say HI, Lord, how are you, and say a quiet prayer, depending upon the kind of day I am having. My brothers all know of the church I am going to, Our Savior, and how much good it has done me.

My friend of about 60 years had his son die of an overdose, and his memorial service was on the East side of Detroit. Liz and I went to the service, and I was impressed. The church is in a mall, and it encompasses about a quarter of the entire mall. I spoke to one of the pastors, who was originally Catholic. He had spent 5 years at Orchard Lake Seminary, and joined the church in the mall. I asked him about his congregation. It was mixed, with many under 40 years of age. At Easter, the service, the main one, was for four thousand plus.

I don't know if I could have done anything different, or if it would have made any difference.

I do know that the Roman Churches are not doing any better. WHY??????????

hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.

For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark.

Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, "The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John:

Cluck, Oink and Moo Sandwiches


4 Thin Sliced Skinless and Boneless Chicken Breasts
8 Slices of Deli Ham
4 Onion Buns
4 Slices Aged Swiss Cheese
4 oz. Garlic and Herb Marinade
4 Slices Tomato
4 Large Lettuce Leaves
8 Tbsp. Mayonnaise

Place the chicken breasts in a 1 gallon Ziploc bag and add the Marinade. Coat the chicken liberally by moving the chicken in the marinade. Place in refrigerator 2-4 hours. Preheat grill, and place the chicken on the top rack. Cook 10 minutes on medium flame. Flip the chicken. Place the ham on a piece of foil on the grill in 2s. Cook both 7 minutes. Place the ham on top of the chicken and add cheese. Cook for 2-3 minutes until cheese is melted. On toasted Onion Buns, place 1 Tbsp. Mayo on top and bottom. On top bun, place tomato and lettuce. Place chicken on bottom and cover. Best served with Onion Rings.
