## **Our Savior Recipe Section**

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

### **Shrimp and Pepper Stuffed Eggplant**

1 eggplant, cut in half lengthwise	1/2 cup olive oil, divided
salt and pepper to taste	1 tbsp basil
12 medium shrimp – peeled, deveined and chopped	1 tsp rosemary
2 cloves garlic, chopped	
1/2 cup green pepper, chopped	
1/2 cup red pepper, chopped	
1/2 cup white wine	
1 green onion, chopped	
1 cup Italian seasoned bread crumbs	
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese, divided (approximately, essentially 1/4 cup plus some for topping)	

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Scoop out the flesh of the eggplant, chop, and re-serve. Coat shells with olive oil, and season with salt and pepper; set aside.
2. Heat 1/4 cup olive oil in a large, deep skillet over medium high heat. Saute shrimp, basil, rosemary and garlic until shrimp turns pink, about 2 minutes. Stir in the reserved chopped eggplant and peppers. Season with salt and pepper. Pour in wine, and cook 5 minutes.
