Today, there were at least six beautiful Monarchs fluttering around. .Florida Monarchs don't migrate. .they stay right here. Just Beautiful !!! But we do miss our home , our church and congregation (and the snow, the hail., the wind, the rain in Michigan..beautiful Michigan!!!).

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is from Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

Sweet Potatoe Tagine

1 tbsp olive oil	1/2 onion, chopped
3 cloves garlic, minced	2 sweet potatoes, peeled and chopped
1 (15.5 ounce) can chickpeas, drained and rinsed	
2 carrots, peeled and chopped	
1 (14.5 ounce) can diced tomatoes with juice	
1 (14 ounce) can chicken broth or vegetable broth	
1 tbsp sugar	1 tbsp lemon juice
1 tbsp cumin	1 tsp salt
1 tsp ground coriander	1 tsp cinnamon
dash cayenne pepper	

1. Heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat, and cook onion, and garlic until onions become translucent.
2. Mix the sweet potatoes, chickpeas, carrots, tomatoes with juice, broth, sugar, and lemon juice into the skillet. Season with salt, cumin, coriander, cinnamon, and cayenne pepper. Bring the mixture to a boil, and continue cooking 30 minutes, until vegetables are tender.
