Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Nan Cramer

Vegetable Chowder

2 c. Cubed, peeled potatoes (Yukon Gold preferred)
2 c. Chicken Broth
1 c. Chopped Baby Carrots (organic preferred)
1/2 c. Chopped Vidalia (sweet yellow) onion
1 14 3/4 oz. can Creamed Corn
1 12 oz. can Evaporated Milk
3/4 c. Shredded Cheddar Cheese
1/2 c. Sliced Fresh Mushrooms
1/4 tsp. Pepper
2 Tbsp. Bacon Bits (optional)

In a pot, potatoes, broth, carrots, and onion. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer uncovered for 10-15 minutes, or until vegetables are tender.

Add corn, milk, cheese, mushrooms and pepper. Cook and stir 4-6 minutes longer, until heated through.

[Optional] Sprinkle with Bacon Bits before serving.
