A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Acts 1:15-17, 20-26

Peter stood up in the midst of the brothers —there was a group of about one hundred and twenty persons in the one place —. He said, "My brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand through the mouth of David, concerning Judas, who was the guide for those who arrested Jesus. He was numbered among us and was allotted a share in this ministry. "For it is written in the Book of Psalms: May another take his office.

"Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection." So they proposed two, Judas called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this apostolic ministry from which Judas turned away to go to his own place." Deacon's Dialogue

Let us all be thankful for the women who gave us birth, raised us to be the people we are. Jesus Christ had a mother, and even He managed to worry her, by staying in the Temple instead of heading home with His parents.

This weekend, I shall again be traveling, warming up the car for the trip to the retreat, which this year is in Illinois, on the other side of Chicago. I just received the order of business, and it looks like quite a bit will be packed into those three days, aside from the drive.

How do I compose a homily? Anytime we talk about the love God has for His people, it reaffirms the gratitude we should all have for the way that Christ sacrificed Himself for us. This week's Gospel is really thought provoking for me. I have gone over it at least five times, and am still trying to figure it out – I'll stop here, and take another reading of it and the direction I wish to take my homily. Two words keep jumping out at me ... CONSECRATE and TRUTH. I think I shall have to go back and read the whole chapter, John 17 to get a better idea of the context with which Christ is speaking.

Jesus is talking to His Apostles, and through them us, to let us know about the joys and perils of the future. Christ is telling them that the future for them will not be like it was while He was around. Just one of His Apostles, Judas, did not work out. But it was done so that Scripture, the foretelling of His life and death would be fulfilled. But with Him gone to the Father, the Apostles and really all of us, would be subject, like Christ was, to the same ill treatment, even unto death. Why might we ask??? Free will. How does this come into play?

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish:

Roasted Asparagus

Ingredients (serves 4):

- 1 lb asparagus, trimmed
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 1 1/2 tbsps Parmesan cheese
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 tbsp lemon juice

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees.
2. Place asparagus in a bowl, combine with olive oil, Parmesan, garlic, salt, and pepper; toss to coat. Arrange asparagus in a single layer on a baking sheet.
3. Bake until tender, about 10-15 minutes. Sprinkle with lemon juice before serving.
