A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Acts 6:1-7

As the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

Frosting

1 cup milk
 1 (3 1/2 ounce) package instant pudding mix, any flavor
 8 ounces Cool Whip
 1/4 to 1/2 cup chopped macadamia nuts

Pour milk into bowl add pudding mix. Beat with wire whisk for 2 minutes. Gently fold in whipped topping.

Frost completely cooled cake, sprinkle with nuts, refrigerate

Macadamia Nut Cake

Cake

2 cups all purpose flour	2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt	1 3/4 cups sugar
1 cup sour cream	3/4 cup vegetable oil
1 tablespoon walnut extract flavoring	4 eggs

Cinnamon mixture

3Tbs packed brown sugar	2 tsp granulated sugar
2 tsp ground cinnamon	

Heat oven to 325°F. Grease 12-cup fluted tube cake pan with shortening or cooking spray; lightly flour.

In large bowl, Mix together flour, baking powder, and salt; stir to blend. Mix in sugar. Add rest of Cake ingredients and beat with electric mixer on medium speed until well blended. Spread half of batter in pan.

In small bowl, stir together Cinnamon Mixture ingredients. Sprinkle over batter in pan. Pour remaining batter over top.


Bake 55 to 60 minutes. Cool in pan 5 minutes. Run knife around edge and center of pan. Place cooling rack upside down over pan; turn rack and pan over. Remove pan.
