Deacon's Dialogue By Rev. Mr. Richard Kasprzak

What a week. I drove to Mundelein, Illinois for a three day retreat. Spent the days discussing our situation and of course, prayer. We had Bishop Mack as the Retreat Master, and he kept us pretty well on subject. Truthfully, the situation with our church is not the best that it could possibly be. What happened?

I have to use my own family as an example, and try to see just what is going on. We were raised as Roman Catholic, my four brothers and one sister. We went to church every Sunday, most of the Holy Days of Obligation, went to Catholic Schools, first Resurrection in East Detroit, then to St.

Stanislaus, and finally to St. Andrew High School in West Detroit. Along the way, I went to Orchard Lake St. Mary's for the ninth grade. Then St. Andrew to finish up till grade twelve. All of us graduated from St Andrew. So what happened?

St Andrew is now closed, and has been since 2008, after being active for 88 years. As I said, I am using my family experience. For the first fifty years, the work situation stayed very stable around St. Andrew. Ford, GM, Chrysler, and their suppliers provided work for the families that attended St. Andrew and the churches around it, including Our Savior on Golgotha, PNCC. The boys and girls graduated High School, some went to college, some joined the military, but eventually all found work near the churches. They married mostly locally, and continued worship at the church they were used to.

World War II and Korea interfered, but mainly that is how it was. Then came the fifties and sixties.



Salt and pepper

Directions:

1. Combine the chicken, bacon, water chestnuts, celery and grapes in large bowl; set aside. In a smaller bowl, combine remaining ingredients; add to the chicken mixture and stir to coat. Chill until serving.
