Deacon's Dialogue

Continued from last week...

The postwar generation is growing up, and the fifties and sixties are their years. For my family, we all went to Catholic schools, Roman Catholic. I went to four different Church schools, while my brothers and sister went to two, Resurrection in Hamtramck, and St. Andrew in West Detroit. And during the whole time, 1952 to 1970, not sure which year in the 70s, we were church attendees.

I joined the Army in 1963, and from then on, my attendance at a church lagged. As a matter of fact, it was not until I discovered Our Savior almost thirty years ago that I became, after a while, a regular church goer. I cannot speak for my brothers, as each had his own way of getting back to church, if ever. Why this pattern? This is not a new discussion, but one that many of the people that I know go through, and not only in the Catholic Church, both our and the Roman church, but also in the Protestant denominations.

I used to think, and say, that my having to go to church while growing up left me with no desire to once I became an adult.... whenever, if ever, adulthood comes to me. But with the greater maturity that I have now, I don't think that is, or was, the reason. To be truly honest, I cannot give a reason. It just seems that during that period of my life, I was doing so many things that I did not have the time or the desire to go. A wife, children, school for me while working, Liz teaching in Canada, working overtime, many times 7 days a week (Thank God that's all the days a week has). My brothers were in the same situation. And as we look around, so many of us in our Church must have gone through the same period of time, with the same result. I go to Church. One brother of mine goes to Church. The grandkids generally do not.

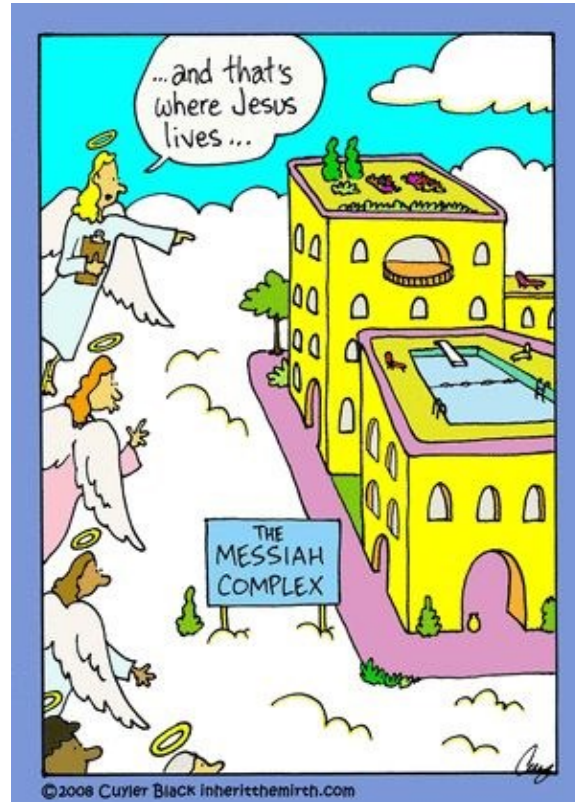

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John:

Chicken Fried Chicken

4 Skinned and Boned Chicken Breasts; 2 1/4 tsp. Salt (divided); 1 1/4 tsp. Ground Pepper (divided); Bread Crumbs (Italian [preferred] or Plain); 1/2 tsp. Baking Powder; 1/2 tsp. Chili Powder; 4 c. Milk (divided); 2 Large eggs; Canola Oil

Directions: Using a kitchen mallet, pound breasts to 1/4 in. thickness. Sprinkle 1/4 tsp. salt and pepper evenly over chicken, set aside. Combine bread crumbs, 1 c. flour, baking powder, 3/4 tsp salt 1/2 tsp pepper and chili powder. Whisk together 3/4 c. milk and eggs. Dredge chicken in bread mixture, dip in milk mixture, dredge again in bread mixture. Pour oil in skillet to 1/2 inch. Heat to 360 degrees. Fry chicken 10 min. adding oil as needed. Turn and fry 4-5 more min. until golden brown. Remove to a pan with a rack, and place in a 225 degree oven to keep warm. Drain oil, reserving cooked bits and 1-2 tbsp. drippings in skillet. Whisk together 1/4 c. flour, remaining salt, pepper and milk. Pour mixture into reserved drippings in skillet, cook over medium-high heat whisking constantly, 10-12 min. until thickened. Serve gravy with chicken. Serves 4.
