A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Acts 5:27b-32, 40b-41

When the captain and the court officers had brought the apostles in and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, "We gave you strict orders, did we not, to stop teaching in that name? Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and want to bring this man's blood upon us." But Peter and the apostles said in reply, "We must obey God rather than men. The God of our ancestors raised Jesus, though you had him killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as leader and savior to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins. We are witnesses of these things, as is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him." The Sanhedrin ordered the apostles to stop speaking in the name of Jesus, and dismissed them. Deacon's Dialogue

Many years ago, when my older daughter was about twelve, we discovered a beautiful place to go on vacation. Actually, my boss at Ford was talking about where his family went on vacation, and the place he mentioned was the seashore in North Carolina, a place called Cape Hatteras. Up until that time, our place for the years' main vacation was the West-Wyoming, Colorado, and the American Southwest. My daughter had discovered dinosaurs, and I also was fascinated. Anyhow, what brought this up was today's Gospel, Christ at the shore of the Sea of Galilee, and the fishing.

On our first trip to Hatteras, my daughter developed a love for fishing. For the longest time, she, and I also, had a rough time catching anything. The fishing rods were expensive, and the bait that I bought did not seem to work very well. We would go out to the shore, get set up, and put the lines in the water. We would watch the line for a bite by the fish, and time after time, when we reeled the lines in, there was nothing on the hooks. One of the locals watched what we were doing, and he finally came over and taught us how to fish in the ocean. Before we went home after a week, my daughter was catching two or three fish on most casts.

And here, we have Christ teaching the Apostles how to catch fish. They did not use hooks, but a net. The net was like the bait on our hooks, catching the fish and bringing them in. As fishers of men, He gave them the knowledge of what was needed to catch men, and our faith as the bait to hook us. We have all of their knowledge...we just need to start fishing.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John.

Jn 21:1-19

At that time, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee’s sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, “I am going fishing.” They said to him, “We also will come with you.” So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, “Children, have you caught anything to eat?” They answered him, “No.” So he said to them, “Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something.” So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, “It is the Lord.” When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, “Bring some of the fish you just caught.” So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, “Come, have breakfast.” And none of the disciples dared to ask him, “Who are you?” because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, “Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?” Simon Peter answered him, “Yes, Lord, you

know that I love you.” Jesus said to him, “Feed my lambs.” He then said to Simon Peter a second time, “Simon, son of John, do you love me?” Simon Peter answered him, “Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.” Jesus said to him, “Tend my sheep.” Jesus said to him the third time, “Simon, son of John, do you love me?” Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, “Do you love me?” and he said to him, “Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.” Jesus said to him, “Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go.” He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when he had said this, he said to him, “Follow me.”

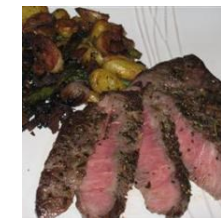
Our Savior Recipe Section

This week’s recipe is by Fr. John.

Peppercorn Flat Iron Steak


1 Flat Iron Steak
1/4 c. Melted Butter
2 Tbsp. Freshly Ground Black Pepper
2 Tbsp. Rosemary
2 Tbsp. Italian Seasoning

Mix together last 4 ingredients in a bowl. Pre-heat gas grill to medium-high. Place Flat Iron Steak on grill and spoon or brush on the mixture. Close lid and cook for 3 minutes. Turn steak and brush on other side. Cook additional 3 minutes. Flip and brush 2 more times, cooking for 3 minutes each time. Finish by moving to lowest rack and cooking for 90 seconds on each side to sear the meat. Cut and serve.
