I had the opportunity to assist at the service. It was my first funeral done in the traditional manner. Father Robert, from All Saints Parish officiated. It was also the first time I had met Father Robert. One thing I noticed, Fr Robert appears to be a very high energy person, always on the move.

John the Apostle was the youngest of the twelve, and the only one that did not suffer martyrdom. He authored The Gospel of John, three of the Epistles of John, and Revelation.

He and St. Peter made preparations for the Last Supper. He was at Gethsemane with Christ, at the Cross when Jesus Died, and received the guardianship of Christ's Mother, Mary, from Jesus on the cross. He died at Ephesus sometime after A.D. 98.

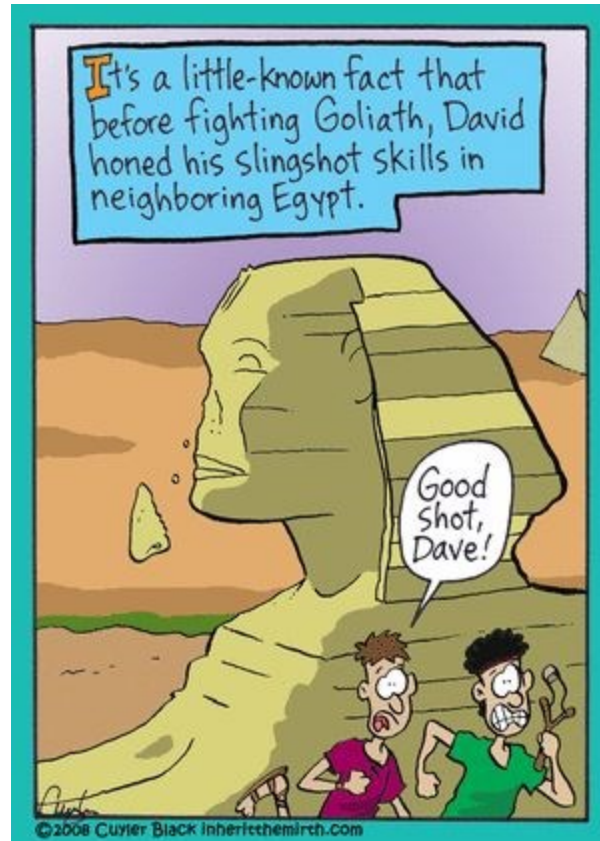

Peanut Butter Banana Breakfast Squares

1 1/2 c quick oats
1/4 c brown sugar
1 tsp baking powder
1/2 tsp salt
2 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp vanilla
1/2 c milk
1 egg
1 large mashed banana
1/4 cup peanut butter


Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. Mix the oats, brown sugar, baking powder, salt and cinnamon in a large bowl. Add in the vanilla, milk, and egg; mix the ingredients together. Add the mashed banana and peanut butter; stir to combine all of the ingredients.
3. Pour the mixture into a lightly greased 8 by 8 inch baking pan. Bake for about 20 minutes.
