

## A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark.

Mk 12:38-44

In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds, "Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. ### **Roasted Brussels Sprouts**

1 lb Brussels Sprouts  
1 Small Package Sliced Almonds

Heat the oil in an electric skillet or large saucepan over medium heat. Add the sliced meat and brown well. Remove meat. Add the gravy mix and water and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Stir in the onion powder, brown sugar, vinegar, Worcestershire sauce, salt and ground pepper. Return the meat to the pan, reduce heat to low and simmer for 1 hour, or until meat is tender.
