Deacon's Dialogue

Unfortunately, we have again suffered a killing, this time in a church in Texas. We need to have this country do some serious praying, for the people who were killed or injured, and that this madness stops.

As I said previously, I am taking an interest in the Bible. Last week was the first of, hopefully, many columns. While researching the languages used, I began to wonder what had happened to the placard that Pilate had inscribed and posted on the cross Jesus died upon. So naturally, I took to the computer and looked up what was written about it. First I discovered that the placard had a name. It was called the "TITULUS CRUCIS, which is Latin for Title of the Cross. It is stored at the church of SANTA CROCE in Rome. So as unbelievable as may seem, the sign exists. But is it the true placard from the crucifixion of Christ? There are doubts.

The church was built in 325 AD by St. Helena, the mother of Constantine the Great. She funded an expedition to the site of the crucifixion, and there located what she claimed to be the true cross as well as many other relics which St. Helena gave to the new church. During the centuries, claims of seeing the placard were made. In 323 A.D. the placard was shown. In the 6th century, a pilgrim to the Holy Land was shown the placard. This was Antoninus of Piacenza. In 1145, the placard was placed in a box and stored. It was not found until 1492, when it was brought back to light.

In 1997, Michael Hesseman bought together 7 experts on Hebrew, Greek and Latin Paleography (the study of ancient languages). After studying the placard, these language experts vouched for the authenticity of the languages as to usage and time. The writing on the placard did match that of first century usage. So to the best of their knowledge, the script is authentic. However, when the wood itself was carbon dated, it turned out to be from between 900 and 1200 AD. The best that could be said about it was that it was a copy of the original artifact and was made in the middle ages.

If anyone has any questions, please let me know. This is supposed to be a dialogue. And always remember, if I don't know it, I have a great imagination.

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John.

Gastropub Style Pork Sandwiches


4 Pork Chops
1/2 c. Garlic and Herb Marinade
8 Pretzel Buns (Aunt Millie's)
2 Tomatoes
8 Large leaves of lettuce
Chipotle Mayonnaise
4 Slices Swiss cheese

Marinate the pork chops in a Ziploc bag in the refrigerator with the Garlic and Herb marinade for 6 hours. Pre-heat grill and place pork chops on top shelf. Cook the pork chops for 6 minutes each side, flipping once during grilling. While the meat is grilling, toast the buns, apply the chipotle mayonnaise to the top and bottom of the buns. At the end of the cooking time, cover the pork chops with the Swiss cheese. Allow to melt, then remove from grill. Add the tomatoes and lettuce to the buns, cut the pork chops in half, and place on bun. Assemble and serve.
