## **Our Savior Recipe Section**

This week's recipe is from Fr. John

### **Steak with Creamy Garlic Shrimp**

4 New York Strip Steaks  
Montreal Steak Seasoning to taste  
4 Tbsp butter, cut into 1 Tbsp pieces  
1/2 lb. shrimp, deveined  
4 cloves garlic  
1/4 c. Chardonnay  
3/4 c. Heavy Cream  
1/4 c. Fresh Shredded Parmesan Cheese  
Salt and Pepper to Taste  
1 Tbsp. Fresh Parsley

Grill steaks as you like them, with the steak seasoning on each side during grilling. When done, place in 180 degree oven to keep warm. Melt 2 Tbsp butter in a skillet, and add shrimp. Cook about 2 minutes and transfer to a bowl, and set aside. Add remaining butter to skillet, add the garlic and sauté for about 1 minute. Pour in the wine, reduce to 1/2 and scrape any bits off the bottom. Reduce heat to low-medium, add cream and bring to a simmer. Stir parmesan in and allow to melt. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Add the shrimp back in, sprinkle with parsley and serve on top of the steaks.
