Gospel Acclamation

Deacon’s Dialogue

While doing my research, I ran across an interesting story, outlining a new museum to be opened in November of this year. It is named the museum of the Bible, and it really looks pretty grand. The building has six floors, each floor being 55 thousand (55,000) square feet.

The front entrance features two 40 foot doors, each weighing 2.5 tons, and having stained glass in them showing the account from Genesis. Upon entrance, there is a grand Lobby with a 200 foot ceiling, lit by LED lighting capable of depicting different visual effects or messages.

Ancient artifacts will be on display in the first floor. The second floor will depict the Bibles impact upon the history of the world and its cultures. The third level will depict the narrative of the Bible, from the time of Abraham to the creation of the Jewish State, to the ministry of Jesus and the early Christian e period. This floor will also contain a large Bible Section.

The fourth floor will present Biblical history and Archeology. The fifth floor will have a performing arts section, with a capacity of 500 patrons. Level six will have a ballroom for a thousand participants, and a viewing area overlooking the Nations Capital and the National mall. The roof will be planted with a Biblical Garden, the plants being from the section of the world that is in the Bible.

I have been to Washington, and have visited certain sites, but Elizabeth has not. We shall have to plan a day of two to visit this new Museum. There are also many other places of interest, beginning with the National Mall, containing the Smithsonian and the White House. The Capital Building, the Lincoln Memorial and Washington Monument, followed by the National Zoological Park round out a busy day and a half or more.

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Nan Cramer.

Pork Stir Fry


1 lb. Regular Cut Pork Chops
1 Egg
1/2 c. Milk
2 c. Panko Bread Crumbs
3 Tbsp. Vegetable Oil
2 c. Chopped Green Peppers
2 c. Bean Sprouts
2 c. Chopped Onion
2-3 Tbsp Oyster Sauce
2-3 Tbsp. Soy Sauce
2-3 Tbsp. Sesame Sauce

Chop pork Cover in the egg/milk mixture and place into a 13x9 in. baking pan with the bread crumbs. Cover pork with crumbs. Heat oil in a wok. Place pork in wok. Cook for 3-4 min on medium heat. Add peppers, sprouts and onion. Cook and stir for an additional 4-6 min on medium/high heat. Add Oyster, Soy and Sesame Sauces. Cook 2-3 additional minutes, stirring occasionally. Serve on white or fried rice. Serves 4.
