St. Chrysogonus Martyr November 24 Fifth century The name of this holy martyr, who was apprehended at Rome, but beheaded at Aquileia in the persecution of Dioclesian, occurs in the canon of the mass, and is mentioned in the ancient Calendar of Carthage of the fifth century, and in all Western Martyrologies since that time. The church in Rome of which he is titular saint, is mentioned in a council held by pope Symmachus, and in the epistles of St. Gregory the Great; it gives title to a cardinal priest. The head of St. Chrysogonus is shown there in a rich case, but his body is at Venice.

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Mrs. Suzanne Sniezek:

Peach French Toast Bake

1 large baguette (about 8 oz)

4 whole eggs

4 egg whites

1 cup milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

5 cups sliced peaches, fresh or frozen

1 ½ tablespoons lemon juice

3 tablespoons brown sugar

1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Spray a 9 by 13 inch baking pan with cooking spray. Slice the baguette into ½ inch slices and arrange the slices in a single layer in the baking pan. Whisk together the eggs, egg whites, milk and vanilla. Pour the egg mixture over the bread in the pan. In a medium bowl, toss peaches with lemon juice and 1 tablespoon of the brown sugar. Scatter the peach slices evenly on top of the bread. Combine the remaining brown sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle over the top. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Uncover and bake for 40 minutes.
