Knowing we were running out of time, we left Tuesday night late and drove up late, got to bed early, and woke up at 8 in the morning. We were lucky that the rain held off until the very end, and our fifth wheel trailer was in storage by 3 O'clock. I've said it many times before, and I'll say it again. Today is the Solemnity of the Christian Family, so our readings are appropriate, and different from the normal Roman liturgy. This Solemnity is for us, all of us, because we all are members of a family. I myself am very happy, as I was adopted into the Kasprzak family, Thomas and Waleria being my father and mother. My father, Tomasz in Polish, raised me as his natural son, and I did not know I had been adopted until I joined the military when I was 18. 

Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Mrs. Nan Cramer

Sauerbraten

1 1/2 lb. Top Round Steak, trimmed and sliced thin
1 Tbsp. Vegetable Oil
1 (.75 oz.) Packet dry brown gravy mix
2 c. Water
1 Tbsp. Onion Powder
1 Tbsp. Brown Sugar
2 Tbsp. Red Wine Vinegar
1 tsp. Worcestershire Sauce
1/2 tsp. Salt
Ground Black Pepper to taste

Heat the oil in an electric skillet or large saucepan over medium heat. Add the sliced meat and brown well. Remove meat. Add the gravy mix and water and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Stir in the onion powder, brown sugar, vinegar, Worcestershire sauce, salt and ground pepper. Return the meat to the pan, reduce heat to low and simmer for 1 hour, or until meat is tender.
