Liz calls me in for breakfast, and in the middle of eating, she announces that today is my daughter's birthday. Today of course, is Wednesday October the 11th. I know that time marches on, whether we want it too or not. But when your child crosses over to where she is closer to fifty than forty, it's a big step.

Matthew 22:1-14

But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' Many are invited, but few are chosen."

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish.

Slow Cooker Chicken Chili


2 chicken breasts
1 (24 oz.) jar of salsa
1 clover garlic, minced
3 tsp cumin
2 tsp chili powder
salt and pepper to taste
1 (11 oz) can of Mexican style corn, drained
1 (15 oz) can pinto beans, drained and rinsed
1 (15 oz) can diced tomatoes

Mix all ingredients together in a slow cooker. Cook on low for 6-8 hours. About 1 to 2 hours before you want to eat, shred the chicken in the pot with 2 forks and continue cooking.
3. Serve with cheese, sour cream, green onions, cilantro, etc.
