Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Mrs. Nan Cramer.

GRILLED PEPPERY TOP ROUND STEAK

beef Top Round Steak, cut 3/4 inch thick (about 1 pound)
pound asparagus, trimmed
teaspoon olive oil
tablespoons shredded Parmesan cheese
Salt
Marinade:
1/4 cup red wine vinegar
tablespoons olive oil
3/4 tsp. each Garlic Powder and Onion Powder
teaspoons steak seasoning blend

Combine Marinade ingredients in medium bowl. Place beef Steak and marinade in food -safe plastic bag; turn steak to coat. Close bag securely and marinate 1-6 hours or as long as overnight, turning occasionally. Remove steak from marinade; discard marinade. Toss asparagus with oil. Place steak in center of grill at medium heat arrange asparagus around steak. Grill steak, covered, 10 to 11 minutes for medium rare (145°F) doneness, turning occasionally. Grill asparagus 6 to 10 minutes or until crisp-tender, turning occasionally. Immediately sprinkle cheese over asparagus. Carve steak into thin slices. Season with salt, as desired. Serve with asparagus.
