I am really looking forward to being back at the Altar. It has been a difficult time for me, not being able to do what I have been used to doing. This past week has been the best I've felt for months, I was able to even help a bit during the pierogi making for the Christmas Fair. This is Thursday, and I shall see how I do navigating the Altar, especially the steps, which are the hardest thing for me to do now. I also have to learn to pick up my feet, as in the last two months have taken a couple of falls, one of which my wife witnessed. She described it as a slow motion back ward sit-down, but the pain in my right cheek is still there.

During my studies toward the Diaconate, one of the subjects was Biblical studies. I found it difficult, as we know, Bible was not one of the things that we learned to the same extent as our Protestant brethren. And now, I use the Bible quite a bit during my sermon preparation. All of us, of course know that the inscription that was placed over the head of Christ was written in three languages, but why? What languages were used and why those and not others? What languages were spoken at the time of Christ?

I shall try to bring some of what I am learning about the time of Jesus, and the beginnings of our Christian Faith to light in my column.

### Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Nan Cramer.

#### Pork Stir Fry


1 lb. Regular Cut Pork Chops  
1 Egg  
1/2 c. Milk  
2 c. Panko Bread Crumbs  
3 Tbsp. Vegetable Oil  
2 c. Chopped Green Peppers  
2 c. Bean Sprouts  
2 c. Chopped Onion  
2-3 Tbsp Oyster Sauce  
2-3 Tbsp. Soy Sauce  
2-3 Tbsp. Sesame Sauce

Chop pork Cover in the egg/milk mixture and place into a 13x9 in. baking pan with the bread crumbs. Cover pork with crumbs. Heat oil in a wok. Place pork in wok. Cook for 3-4 min on medium heat. Add peppers, sprouts and onion. Cook and stir for an additional 4-6 min on medium/high heat. Add Oyster, Soy and Sesame Sauces. Cook 2-3 additional minutes, stirring occasionally. Serve on white or fried rice. Serves 4.
