Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John:

Alpen Burger

1 lb. Ground Chuck or Ground Sirloin
4 Slices Swiss Cheese
12 oz. Mushrooms (canned or fresh, both work)
2 c. Dry Red Wine (Cabernet Sauvignon or Merlot)
2 Tbsp. Garlic Powder
2 Tbsp. Rosemary
2 Tbsp. Italian Seasoning
1 Tbsp. Sugar
4 Hamburger Buns
Butter and Mayonnaise

Combine wine, garlic, rosemary, Italian seasoning, and sugar into a medium sized skillet. Bring to boil. Form 4- 1/4 lb. patties out of the ground beef and cook on medium-high heat for 15-20 min.


After the wine mixture has boiled for 3-4 minutes, add the mushrooms and reduce heat to medium. Allow wine mixture to reduce and stir mushrooms occasionally. Add cheese to top of burgers and cook an additional 2-3 minutes to melt the cheese. Toast the buns, place butter on the bottom bun and mayonnaise on the top. Add burger, add mushrooms and cover sandwich.
