All of a sudden, ready or not, we got a quick taste of the weather to come, falling into Autumn My surgery went well, should be back next Sunday.

Liz mentioned that Audrey had started her teaching job, and I wondered how it had gone. Then knowing Liz had spent many years teaching, I asked her how her first days went. We were not married at that time, matter of fact, I had not even met her. She started in September, and we met in November. Anyhow, she said it was not an easy beginning, being a twenty year old teacher, just out of Teachers College, and entering a sixth grade class consisting of 45 students. I've got a good imagination, but this is something that is beyond me. We talked about that, and I asked if she would mind writing a little bit about her early times teaching..

From Liz:" I had to go back and think a bit about my first year of teaching. First was a year of Teachers' College. Total practice teaching time in classroom that year... maybe 8 weeks... and always with the teacher in attendance should things get out of control!!!"

Hiring took place in June. My girlfriend and I went in together. She was engaged and took her ring off because she was afraid she wouldn't be hired. We came in and before we had even sat down, two contracts were handed to us, along with pens, so that we could sign the contracts. We were done in 5 minutes. That was it. We were hired." I should add that this happened in the 60's and there was a tremendous shortage of teachers. Meanwhile schools were filled to capacity with children. HUGE CLASSES. (To be continued...)

We are now back to the Ordinary time, but let's remember that brotherly love we were reminded about. As I said before, my experiences with strangers have been great. I cannot remember the last time that I have had an unpleasant event with a stranger. The Disciples of Christ had been with Him for quite a while by now, but they still had difficulty accepting who He was, and what His purpose on Earth was. Jesus kept up the teaching of the twelve, letting them know His future suffering is not in vain.



Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Laura Pearce, friend of the Parish

Pineapple Chicken Curry

1 tbsp oil
2 chicken breasts, cut into strips or chunks
2 tbsp curry powder
1 (13.5 ounce) cans coconut milk
3 tbsp fish sauce
1/4 cup sugar
1 can bamboo shoots, drained
1/2 red bell pepper, julienned (ie cut into strips)
1/2 green bell pepper, julienned
1/2 onion, sliced into strips
1 can pineapple, drained

In a wok or large pan, saute chicken in oil for about 5 minutes. Add curry, coconut milk, fish sauce, sugar and bamboo shoots. Bring to a boil and then reduce heat slightly and cook for about 10 minutes. Add peppers and onions; continue cooking for about 10 minutes, until chicken is fully cooked and peppers are tender. Stir in the pineapple and serve over rice.
