Deacon's Dialogue

Well, we are saying goodbye to John, but just for a little time. So, what did I learn from these four weeks, while we listened to the Gospel readings from St. John? First a quick review as to who he was, or is, as he is still with Our Lord. John was the youngest of the Apostles, chosen early in Christ's ministry. He accompanied Jesus for the three years Christ's ministry, was present at the crucifixion, where Jesus put him in charge of His mother, Mary with the words "WOMAN, BEHOLD YOUR SON", and to St. John "BEHOLD YOUR MOTHER". He was also with St. Peter when they went to the tomb and viewed the tomb being empty, just the burial cloths left behind. And as we learned earlier, he was the only one of the Apostles who escaped martyrdom, and died of old age. His Gospel is the only one that is actually first hand, and not taken from oral or written histories. More about this later, as we shall be with St. Mark for a while.

Liz and I shall be traveling "UP NORTH" for the LABOR DAY weekend, but we always return for Sunday Mass, barring any mishap. You know, even when we are in Florida, our church there, St. Mary by the Sea in St. Augustine, is almost a hundred miles away (89.3), so traveling to church is not a big deal. Matter of fact, St. Joseph in Davie Florida, another of our Churches, is 246 miles away. We really are spread out here in the U.S. Fr. Mendelewski, the pastor of St. Joseph, very kindly invited Liz and myself to visit. As it happens, before I was Deacon, we traveled to Davie, the city St. Joseph is in, for spring breaks while Liz was still teaching. Fr. Paul, now Bishop Paul, was the Pastor there. We shall see how things shape up, as 240 miles is a BIT FAR TO GO for Sunday Mass.



A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark.

Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. — So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?" He responded, "Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts. You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition." He summoned the crowd again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. "From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile."

Garlic Parmesan Baked Chicken

2 tbsp olive oil
1 clove garlic, minced
2/3 c bread crumbs
1/2 c Parmesan cheese
1 tsp basil
1 tsp oregano
pepper to taste
4 chicken breasts

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and lightly grease a baking dish.
2. Combine olive oil and garlic on a plate. On a separate plate, combine breadcrumbs, cheese, basil, oregano, and pepper.
3. Dip chicken breasts in olive oil mixture, transfer to the other plate and coat with breadcrumb mixture. Arrange chicken on baking dish and bake for 30-40 minutes, or until chicken is no longer pink in the middle.
