Lk 10:25-37

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test him and said, “Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” Jesus said to him, “What is written in the law? ## Our Savior Recipe Section

This week's recipe is by Fr. John.

### Cheesy Creamed Spinach

12 oz. bag Frozen Cut Leaf Spinach  
3/4 cup water  
6 oz. Cheese Sauce (Kroger or Cheese Whiz)  
2-3 Tbsp. Garlic Powder

In a saucepan, place 3/4 cup of water and bring to a boil. Place entire contents of spinach into water and cook at medium-high heat for 6-8 minutes covered. Stir in cheese sauce in 2 oz. increments until fully mixed. Add garlic powder to taste, stirring into mixture.

Serves 4, best paired with grilled Ribeye Steaks.
